



New Hires of 14 - 18 Year Olds



- The Census Bureau's Local Employment Dynamics Program, among other things, provides valuable information concerning workforce demographics. This Note examines teen employment trends in Nevada.
- Third quarter info provides useful insight into summer hiring activity. The number of teens who were able to find summer jobs during the past four summers is approximately one-half of what it was before the recession.
- Recently, fewer teens are finding employment during the summer as they have faced a tougher labor market weakened by recession and competition from older, more experienced age groups for entry-level jobs.
- A close examination of the information suggests that "churn" in the labor market has declined. It appears that when teens obtain employment, they are more likely to stay in that job, compared to pre-recession.
