## 16 out of 17 Counties Realize Pay Increases from 2013 to 2014 (Change in Weekly Wage per County; Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages Data)



- In the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) Program, the Research and Analysis Bureau collects and compiles employment and wage data for workers covered by Nevada unemployment insurance laws, and federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees.
- Weekly wages for all counties in Nevada increased 1.3% from 2013 to 2014.
- Change in weekly wages range from -0.2% (Churchill) to 4.8% (Esmeralda). Although several counties experienced slower wage growth than the overall average, Churchill County is the only county to realize a decline in wages from 2013 to 2014.
- As for Nevada's major population centers: Carson City, at 1%, falls slightly below the State average; Clark County is concurrent with Nevada's wage growth, at 1.3%; finally, Washoe County wages experienced a faster growth rate than the Silver State, at 2.1%.
