

40% of Nevada Employees Paid More Than \$17 per Hour (Employment by Wage Range; 2014 Occupational Employment Statistics Data)



- The Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) survey is a semi-annual mail survey measuring occupational employment and wage rates for wage and salary workers in nonfarm establishments in Nevada and all states.
- Nearly 480,400 Nevada employees earn more than \$17 per hour, equating 42% of the total workforce. One-fifth of employees earn over \$26.50 per hour.
- The highest concentration of employment belongs to the \$12 to \$17 per hour wage range, at 41% of total Nevada employment, or 465,400 workers. The second largest group of the workforce belongs to the \$17 to \$26.50 per hour group, with 22% of all workers.
- The \$37.00 to \$45.00 per hour bracket has the lowest percentage of Silver State employment, at 51,000 workers, or 4.5% of total employment.
- The lowest paying wage range (\$12 per hour or less) encompasses 192,800 workers, making up 16.9% of total employment. In contrast, the highest paying bracket (\$45 per hour or more) makes up 5.3% of the workforce, with 60,000 employees.
